The Self Employment Program

The training provided under SEP will help you find your path to business success. Each participant in the program creates their own business plan, and receives business coaching, training and start-up assistance.

To qualify for SEP, you must be:

- currently unemployed,
- legally entitled to work in Canada, and
- able to demonstrate that you have:
 - an established Employment Insurance (EI) claim, or
 - received an EI claim that ended in the last 36 months, or
 - received parental or maternity benefits within the last 60 months.

How do I get started?

If you have an idea for a small business, are interested in self-employment and think you may qualify for the Self Employment Program, contact your local Labour Market Services office.

A Client Service Consultant from your local Labour Market Services office will meet with you to discuss whether the Self-Employment Program is right for you.
